What is Public Health?

Dr. Tom Porter, Specialist Registrar in Public Health Oxford Deanery (2007) states that public health relates to the health of the population- rather than the individual.

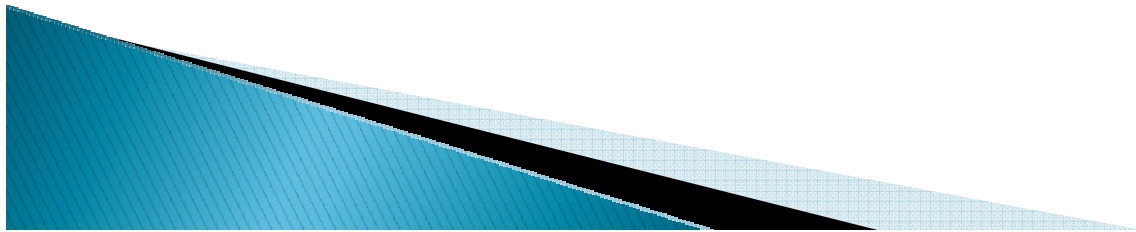
This more holistic approach involves

Tracking illness frequency within a population [including infectious disease outbreaks]; preventing illness and promoting good health

Reducing Health Inequalities - much illness is a direct, or indirect, result of socioeconomic background.

Ensuring that assessments are made for the good of the population rather than purely the individual.

In health services, where resources are limited (as in most countries with a publicly-funded service), public health also plays a part in health service structure and allocating resources. Many different Governmental and non-Governmental agencies are involved in practising public health including the National Health Service (NHS), local councils and education authorities, the prison service, pharmacies, private businesses, and charities. The subject crosses so many different fields, resulting in public health being practised by a large number of different professionals from a wide variety of backgrounds. For example, in the UK these include people working within public health, nursing, medical and dental fields.
