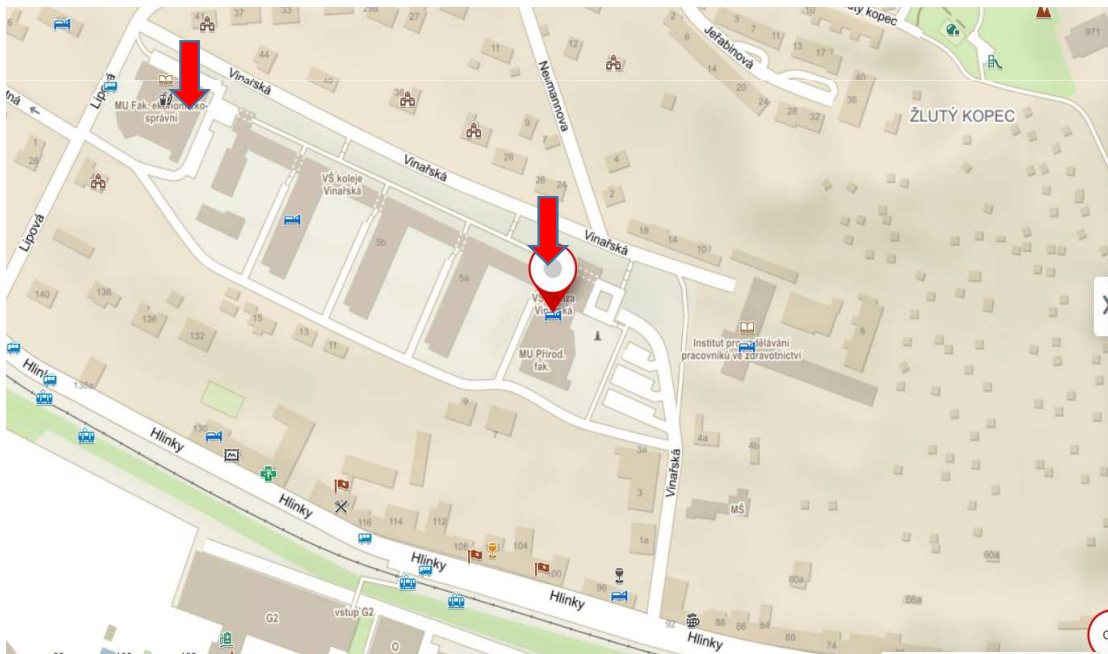

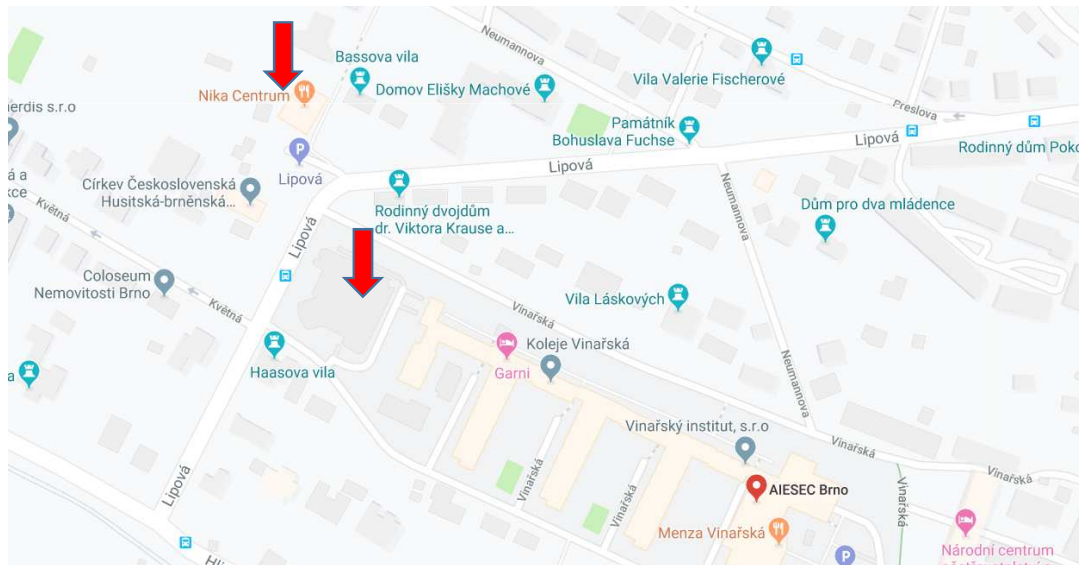

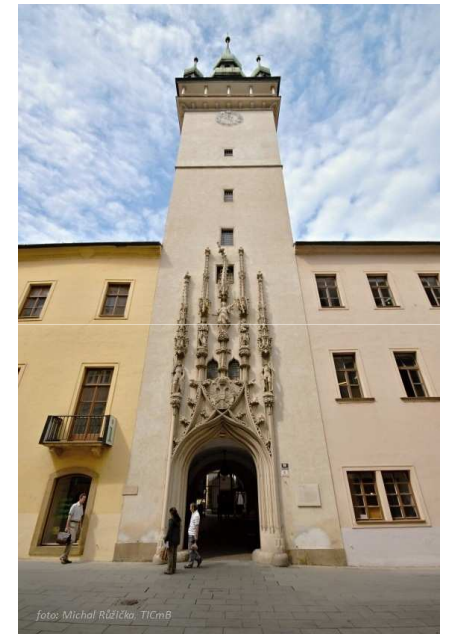

Old Town Hall

- Radnická street 8
- Opening hours: Mo - Su 10:00 am - 10:00 pm

The Old Town Hall is the oldest and most interesting historical secular building in Brno. It was the venue for council meetings and court proceedings; it is where medieval documents, seal and money were safeguarded; it was the seat of the city's scribe; notable guests were entertained here and the commander of defense forces was headquartered here during military operations.



Špilberk Castle

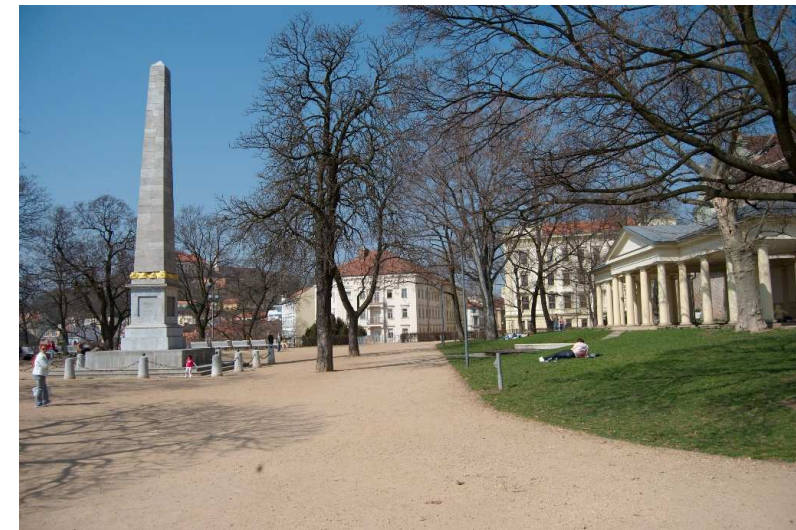

- Špilberk Castle was established in the 13th century by Přemysl Otakar II to protect both the Czech lands and the town of Brno. An occasional residence of Moravian margraves, the castle became a huge military fortress in the 17th and 18th centuries. In 1783, as decreed by Emperor Joseph II, it was transformed into a jail for serious criminals and soon also for political prisoners from countries throughout the Austro-Hungarian Empire. Špilberk was known as the harshest jail in Europe.



Cathedral of St Peter and Paul

The cathedral – nicknamed Petrov, like the hill – dates back to the 11th and 12th centuries, when a Romanesque chapel was built on the top of a hill. At the end of the 12th century, a small church with an apse and a crypt was built there, and in the 13th century it was expanded into a Romanesque basilica, the remains of which were discovered during an archaeological study of the cathedral at the end of the 20th century; the site is now open to the public.

- The Villa Stiassni was built in 1927-1929 for the Jewish textile manufacturer Alfred Stiassni, according to designs by the famous Brno architect Ernst Wiesner.

Anthropos Pavillon

- The Anthropos Pavilion was built in 1962 for the exhibition of the same name created by Prof. Karel Absolon in 1928. Absolon's Anthropos was part of his project to establish an international institute researching the origins of man and his culture. The building underwent a complex renovation in 2006.

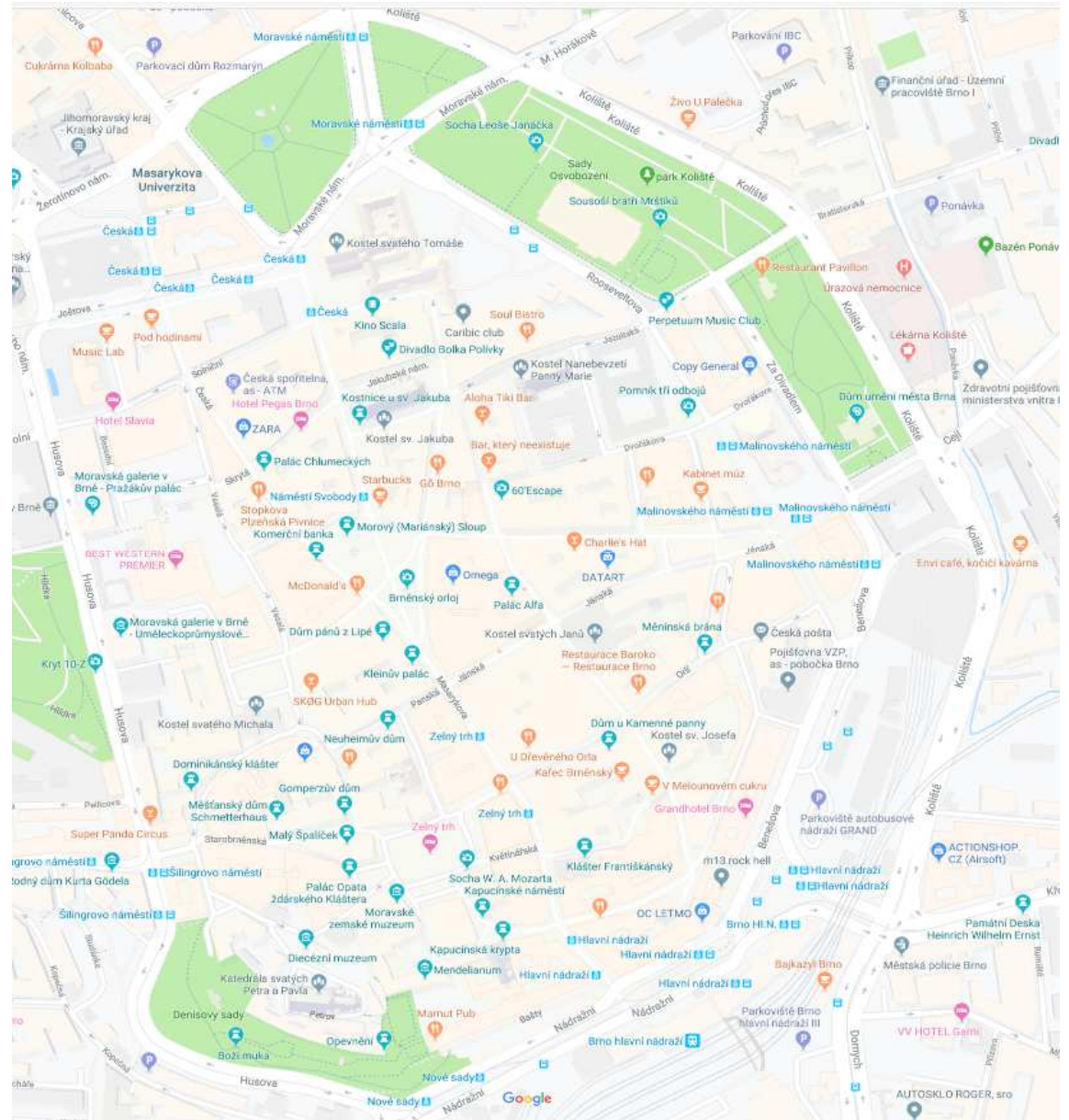

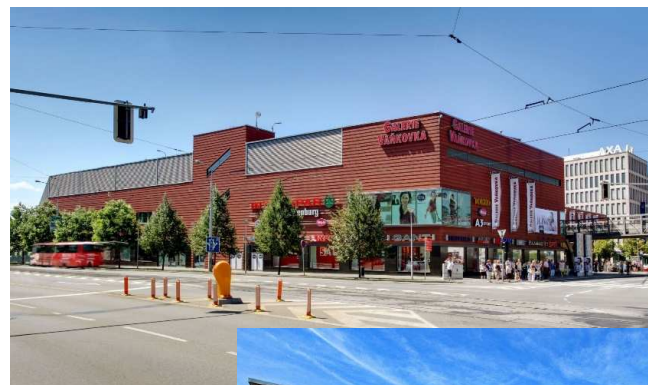
